1 Thes. 5:12-21 - "12) Now we ask you, brothers, to respect those who work hard among you, who are over you in the Lord and who admonish you. 13) Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work. Live in peace with each other 14) And we urge you, brothers, warn those who are idle, encourage the timid, help the weak, be patient with everyone. 15) Make sure that nobody pays back wrong for wrong, but always try to be kind to each other and to everyone else. 16) Be joyful always; 17) pray continually; 18) give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. 19) Do not put out the Spirit's fire; 20) do not treat prophecies with contempt. 21) Test everything. absurd – making no sense at all, going completely against or having no reason
avalanche – a large mass of snow, ice, rocks, or other material sliding or falling swiftly down a mountainside; something resembling such an event
classify – to group or label in an organized way
ensure – to make sure, safe, or certain; to guarantee
navigate – to plan and steer the course of a vessel or vehicle; to make one's way, get around
nestle – to settle down comfortably; to hold lovingly
plea – an urgent request for help; the answer given in a law court by a person accused of a crime
principle – a basic rule a law on which others are based; a belief used to tell right from wrong
realistic – using facts and good sense to evaluate people, things or situations; concerned with the practical; resembling real life
security – freedom from danger, fear, or doubt; safety
selective – very careful about choosing or using
tart – having a sharp or sour taste; sharp in manner or tone; a small pie
